Funding provided for Curriculum Enrichment in the form of residential visits, school trips, coaches, swimming activities to enable children to access a range of 'Real Life' experiences.
 Breakfast Club and After School activities to continue to support parents of Pupil Premium children
 Additional support from teaching assistants within the classroom, and through small-group tuition.
 Intervention groups with members of the Senior Leadership team to help and support children's learning in addition to their daily Maths and English lessons.
 Additional support from the school's Parent and Family Support Advisor.

- Two Teaching assistants, one part time and one full time to work alongside children struggling in the core areas of reading, writing and maths.
- 'Ignite and Inspire' intervention to help pupils catch up with their peers in reading and maths.
- Continuation of 'Woodland Writing' group where pupils are taken off site and inspired to write through forest school experiences.
- Accelerated Reader project to help assess and support pupils' progress in reading.
- New up to date reading books of high interest to support pupils' love of reading.
- Support from school's Parent and Family Support Advisor to help improve attendance.
- I pads and IT equipment continued to be used to enhance the learning of pupils in all areas of the curriculum and used to help pupils record their ideas in different ways.
- New Resources for Maths and English to provide additional support in class.
- Individualised resources provided as and when pupils need extra support.

- Percentage of pupils, including SEND pupils met their challenging targets – 88% in reading, 75% in Writing and 81% in Maths at the end of KS2. 19% of pupils in Reading achieved L6 and 6% in Maths achieved L6
- In year 3 on average 74% of Pupils met or exceeded their challenging targets in Reading, Writing and Maths
- In Year 4 on average 71% of Pupils met or exceeded their challenging targets in Reading, Writing and Maths
- In Year 5 on average 78% of Pupils met or exceeded their challenging targets in Reading, Writing and Maths
- Resources used in Maths and English made a good impact on pupils' progress and provided the children with alternative ways to learn.
- Pupils were able to access a wide range of experiences inside and outside of school to help with their learning and their emotional wellbeing.
- In Year 3, Pupil Premium children made better progress in writing than Non Pupil Premium children.
