#### Additional Support 2014/5

Emotional literacy support helping children develop their social skills, their emotional development and providing additional pastoral support.

Curriculum Enrichment £2865.00 was spent on funding school trips, coaches, swimming activities to enable children to access a range of experiences..

Free Breakfast and After School activities

Additional support from teaching assistants within the classroom, and through small-group tuition.

Intervention groups with members of the Senior Leadership team to help and support children's learning in addition to their daily Maths and English lessons.

Additional support from the school's Parent and Family Support Advisor.

#### Curriculum Focus 2014/5

- Additional funding provided a teaching assistant to work alongside children who were struggling in the core areas of reading, writing and maths.
- Support for reading, writing and spelling within class.
- Talk for Writing and Maths in Context training.
- Support from school's Parent and Family Support Advisor and intervention for Maths.
- Support from school's Parent and Family Support Advisor. Specialist transition support planned for Spring and Summer Term.
- Ipads and IT equipment were purchased to enhance the learning of the children in all areas of the curriculum and used to help children record their ideas in different ways.
- Resources were purchased in Maths and English to provide additional support in class.
- School library has been fully stocked with a huge variety of new books to encourage children to enjoy reading.
- Individual class teachers have purchased individualised resources to help and support children with their learning

#### Measuring the impact of PPG spending 2014/5

- High Need pupils now have improved access to the curriculum through top up funding and increased access to resources and 1:1 support.
- All pupils have made progress with some pupils exceeding expectations. Resources used in Maths and English are impacting on children's progress and providing the children with alternative ways to learn.
- Children are able to access a wide range of experiences inside and outside of school to help with their learning and their emotional wellbeing.
