Behaviour – Rewards and Sanctions

October 2016

Rewards:

- Praise – From any adult throughout the school.
- Display of children's work- a celebration of work either in classrooms or displays around the school.
- "Thank You" Stickers- Given out by the office staff.
- "Star of the Week" – Awarded by class teacher in celebration assembly.
- House points – Awarded in childrens' books.
- "WOW Work" cards – Awarded for exceptional work.
- "Well Done" Certificates – Handed out by Headteacher in Celebration Assembly.
- "Head Teacher's Award" Stickers – Awarded by Headteacher for exceptional achievement.
- Whole Class Rewards Dojo points – Awarded for behavior in class.
- Star on the Traffic Light System – Awarded for attitude and work ethos.

Support in school for improving self esteem and attitude to learning:

- Alternative Play – Lunchtime nature group.
- Social and emotional intervention.
- Restorative Justice Approach and use of language.
- Circle Time.

Stages for managing behaviour

- Peer Mediation – use of ABC monitors and discussions between children involved overseen by the class teacher.
- Restorative discussions – Face to face informal meeting with children involve, overseen by class teacher or TA.
- Restorative conference – A more formal meeting where family members may be invited to attend, overseen by class teacher.
- Continuous unacceptable behavior – Use of internal exclusion, involvement of Senior Leadership Team and regular meetings with parents.
- Persistent unacceptable behavior – Referred to Deputy/Headteacher where external exclusion may be considered. Regular meetings with parents.

Use of Traffic light system

- All children start on green each day.
- After one or two warnings, moved to amber.
- Moved to red and sent out of class for 10 minutes.
- 5 reds within a half term will result in a letter being sent home to parents

Swearing

- Any child overheard swearing by an adult will have a letter sent home.
- Any child overheard swearing by another child will be spoken to by the class teacher or an adult on duty and given a warning.
