### Additional Support 2018/19

Funding provided for Curriculum Enrichment in the form of residential visits, school trips, Horse Riding, cost towards transport and swimming activities to enable children to access a range of 'Real Life' experiences.  
Breakfast Club and After School activities to support parents of Pupil Premium children  
Additional support from teaching assistants within the classroom, and through small-group tuition.  
Intervention groups with members of the Senior Leadership Team to help and support children's learning in addition to their daily Maths and English lessons.  
Additional support from the school's Parent and Family Support Advisor and School Counsellor.  
Additional support provided for Year 3 in the Autumn Term with a focus on phonic teaching to fill the gaps in learning.

### Curriculum Focus 2018/19

- Renewed subscription of Accelerated Reader project to help assess and support pupils' progress in reading.
- New up to date reading books of high interest to support pupils' love of reading.
- Ipads and IT equipment continued to be used to enhance the learning of pupils in all areas of the curriculum and used to help pupils record their ideas in different ways.
- Funding provided for Beanstalk Reading intervention to help change children's attitudes towards reading and to increase attainment.
- Individualised resources provided based on individual need.
- Forest School provision and outdoor learning to help improve standards and promote children's wellbeing.
- Out of school opportunities to enhance children's experiences to increase motivation, knowledge and aspirations.
- Parental workshops to provide help to parents to support their children at home.
- Provide quality TA support in all classes where pupils are given the support they need from interventions to make accelerated progress in all key areas.
- Additional TA training in interventions such as ILI, Precision Teach and spelling detectives to help fill gaps in learning for key individuals.
- Additional support provided by SLT members in Year 6 to accelerate progress in all key areas based on the end of year data in Year 5.

### Measuring the impact of PPG spending 2017/8

- Pupil Premium children in Year 6 gained achieved +3.9 tracking points in reading with 83.3% of pupils reaching the expected standard. In Maths, Pupils achieved +4.3 tracking points with 79.2% reaching the expected standard and in Writing they achieved +3.9 tracking points with 83.3% reaching the expected standard. This is above the challenging targets of +3.5 tracking points set by the school and helped the us to achieve our highest end of year SAT's scores ever.
- In Year 5 Pupil Premium children achieved +2.9 tracking points in writing, +3.0 tracking points in reading and +3.1 tracking points in Maths. This particular cohort will receive additional support as they enter Year 6.
- In Year 4. Pupil premium children achieved +4.0 tracking points in writing, +4.3 tracking points in Reading and +4.1 Tracking points in Maths. This is well above the expected +3.5 Tracking points set by the school.
- In Year 3, Pupil Premium children achieved +3.8 Tracking points in writing, +3.7 Tracking points in Reading and +3.6 tracking points in Maths. Year 3 achieved above expected progress in all three core areas.
- Through careful analysis and monitoring of SPTO, gaps in learning were quickly identified and pupils were given additional support when needed to fill the gaps.
